The continued success of this event is a testament to the business community's dedication to ethical business practices.

# **Educating Our Community**



Our consumer education programs empowered us to inform and educate thousands throughout the year on essential topics such as scams, deceptive advertising, and unethical marketplace practices.

As part of these efforts, we partnered with the State of Tennessee to host Building Your Dream Team, an educational event highlighting state programs designed to support businesses and strengthen the workforce.

The event featured Commissioner Thomas of the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development as a special speaker, along with Kristie Holmes, owner of Accredited Business, The HR Dept. LLC.



Coffee & Connections was a new initiative started in 2024, to connect business owners with like minded individuals in a casual setting. Coffee & Connections was designed to help members and the local business community hone their connection skills and build an effective network to grow their businesses. Professor Thom Coats, Director of Marketing and Center of Professional Selling at Middle TN State University was one of our expert educators.

BBB is dedicated to keeping consumers in the 45 counties we serve well-informed by sharing our expertise on relevant news topics. In 2024, we provided crucial information on several key issues affecting our community.

One of the top stories involved hackers targeting Rutherford County Schools and allegedly selling district data. In response, BBB offered consumers helpful tips on protecting themselves, including the importance of using malware protection software on all devices and ensuring passwords are at least 14 characters long, changed every one to two months.

Following the devastating tornadoes in Montgomery County, BBB offered guidance to individuals seeking rental properties. Many were scammed into paying for non-existent rental homes. We advised consumers to avoid paying deposits through Venmo or Zelle, to use credit cards for added protection, and to never make payments without first seeing the property in person.

We also contributed to a viral news story about hair braiding scams affecting Middle Tennessee. Fraudsters on social media platforms like Instagram and TikTok posed as professional hair braiders, showcasing false photos of their services. Customers were asked to pay deposits before scheduling appointments, only for the appointments to never materialize, and the social media pages to disappear after payment. This story garnered nearly a million views, helping to protect countless consumers in our region. Through these contributions, BBB remains committed to supporting and educating the community to avoid scams and protect their interests.







# NOVEMBER IS THANK A BUSINESS MONTH

Thank a business month was an initiative started in 2023 by the International Association of Better Business bureaus (IABBB).

During the month of November, counties are given the opportunity to declare November Thank a business month in their counties by issuing a proclamation.

We received declarations from Davidson, Montgomery, Dickson, Smyrna, Murfreesboro, and Columbia.









# **BBB INTEGRITY FOUNDATION**

The work of the BBB Integrity Foundation (IF) has always been an extension of BBB of Middle Tennessee and Southern Kentucky, and in 2024, we continued that mission by expanding our programs and introducing new opportunities for local businesses.

Spring 2024 was an exciting and eventful season for the Integrity Foundation. In April, we hosted our second Big Blue Bash networking event, which was a complete sellout, our largest turnout yet, with all tables and sponsorships claimed.

Spring also featured the Spark Awards, celebrating outstanding new entrepreneurs in Middle Tennessee, along with the Torch Awards, recognizing businesses of all sizes for their commitment to integrity. We wrapped up the season by awarding 10 deserving high school seniors with college scholarships through our Students of Integrity program. The program honors young leaders who exemplify ethical behavior, community service, and academic excellence.

In Fall 2024, we launched something new, our first Discovery Night networking event in downtown Nashville. It was a fantastic evening with a strong turnout from both BBB members and non-members. We kept the momentum going into October with our annual Songwriter's Night at The Factory in Franklin, where over 230 guests gathered for a night of music and networking.

2024 was a year of growth and new opportunities, and we're excited for what's ahead in 2025! We plan to expand the Big Blue Bash, host multiple Discovery Nights across Middle Tennessee, and introduce Coffee & Connections for early morning networking. We can't wait to see you at our events in the coming year!



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
